

## Geographical scope of research projects



### Requirements for application

- Excellent M.A. degree in one of the disciplines represented at the Graduate School
- Outline of the dissertation project (up to 6 pages);
- Curriculum vitae (up to 3 pages);
- Certified copies of degrees received;
- Proof of proficiency in English (C1 CFER or equivalent)
- Evidence of proficiency in the language(s) relevant to the dissertation project;
- One letter of recommendation

- C1 CFER;
- ETS TOEFL certificate (minimum score of 600 for the paper-based test, 250 for the computer-based test, and 100 for the internet-based test)
- Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English, CPE (any grade);
- Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English, CAE (grade A or B);
- IELTS test (level 7.0);

You may be **exempt** from this verification, if

- a) you are native English speaker, or
- b) have graduated from an English speaking university in a country with English as an official language.

There are no other exemptions.

## Eligibility

It is important that the choice of discipline (which is connected to your preferred supervisor) should relate to your previous academic achievements AND to your planned doctoral research.

The consideration of the following three points can help you to better assess your eligibility for a specific discipline:

- Check if you have learned the relevant methodological and theoretical skills to pursue a doctoral degree in the discipline that you choose.
- Consider the research that our supervisors are engaged in to determine whether your planned doctoral research falls within their area of interest and expertise.
- Consider the department websites for information about the courses our supervisors teach on the B.A. and M.A. level.

- Interviews between 8-12 February, 2021
- Notifications sent out after 22 February, 2021
- Applications for admission for doctoral studies submitted by 15 June, 2021
- Enrollment as doctoral students by 30 September, 2021
- Begin of the programme on 1 October, 2021

### Requirements for application

- !!! Check individual requirements for different application types !!!
- Excellent M.A. degree
- Curriculum vitae
- a letter of motivation that describes why you are applying at the FSGS / EXC TC
- Outline of the dissertation project up to 10 pages and a 1 page summary (exception: EXC TC PhD within a project)
- a time schedule for three years (exception: EXC TC PhD within a project)
- a work sample (no longer than 15-20 pages)
- · Certified copies of degrees received
- Proof of proficiency in English AND German (one language C1, the other B2)
- contact details of two experts in the field (generally university faculty) who are willing to write a letter of recommendation for you

- •To apply for the Graduate School knowledge of German AND English is necessary.
- •You need proof of one langauge at the level C1, the other one at the level B2.
- •You do not need to hand in language certificates, if
- •
- a) you are native English or German speaker, or
- b) have graduated from an English or German speaking university in a country with English or German as an official language.



## Research Program




The research program aims at developing a theoretically informed and empirically grounded understanding of the origins, effects, and interdependence of institutions. The research approach combines regional expertise with a strong social science focus in a relevant discipline.

#### **Core Competences:**

- excellent area expertise on one country in East Asia (China, Japan, Korea)
- broad regional competence in East Asia
- high competence in at least one East Asian language
- strong methodological skills in a discipline
- interdisciplinary competence
- international network within East Asian Studies and the relevant discipline
- transregional and transcultural expertise /encouraging students to a 6-month fieldwork
- Summer School
- Transferable skills (Dahlem Research School, Methods)

## Requirements for Applications

- an excellent Masters or equivalent degree (M.A. or German Magister with a grade of "very good" (A-) or better) in an East Asian Studies field or in a social science or humanities discipline with a focus on East Asia.
- BA-Fast Track possible with an excellent BA degree (only A+) and intercultural experience

- CV
- Motivation letter
- Research proposal including a research question (maximum 6 pages)
- time schedule for the dissertation
- copies of certificates of relevant degrees and language skills (Englisch C1/Korean, Japanese or Chinese B2)
- 2 letters of recommendation

## GEAS Specific Language requirements

### • English C1

- test (IELTS, TOEFL or Cambridge)
- English-taught MA programme in either UK, USA or Germany (and countries where requirements of C1 are already met)
- Results can be submitted later to the date of interview

#### Chinese B2

- HSK 5 or TOCFL 4 or higher with sufficient time abroad
- MA degree in Chinese Studies (including language classes)
- teacher's assessment if HSK6 is not available

#### Japanese B2

- JLPT N2 or higher (can be submitted later) with sufficient time spent abroad
- MA degree in Japanese Studies (including language classes)
- teacher's assessment if N2 is not available

#### Korean B2


- TOPIK 4 or higher with sufficient time spent abroad
- MA degree in Korean Studies) (including language classes)
- teacher's assessment if TOPIK is not available

## Research Proposal (6 pages)

- Context, research questions and objectives of your research project
  - What is the main argument?
  - What is the central question you aim to answer in your thesis and why is your question relevant?
  - What are the hypotheses relevant for answering your question?
  - Is there a possible outcome or plan B?
- Current state of research and most relevant literature
  - Place your topic in the current academic debate
  - · literature review
- Tentative theoretical framework and research methods
  - Which methodology and theoretical framework will you use and why?
  - What are relevant sources for information and how would your fieldwork be conducted?
- Source material (6th page)
  - Bibliography
- Time schedule (not counting within the six page limit)
  - Detailed schedule with milestones and fieldwork plan

The Graduate School of North American Studies (GSNAS) is dedicated to a comprehensive interdisciplinary analysis of North American societies from the early modern era to the present.













## Our Research Focus between 2019 and 2024 is "Transformations of 'Democracy' in North America"

Our research program aims to provide an *interdisciplinary* framework for investigating American notions, imaginations, and practices of "democracy," especially in the areas of domestic and foreign policy, economic development, cultural production, literary processing, and the negotiation of social relations in a multi-ethnic society, as well as on the level of media-ecological change. Our analysis of these aspects is grounded in a *research-oriented* and *curriculum-based* collaboration of six disciplines from the humanities and the social sciences.

These six disciplines are:

- Cultural Studies
- Economics/Economic history
- History
- Literary Studies
- Political Science
- Sociology





## Call for Applications 2020/21

- 5 scholarships of 1,350 EUR/month for a duration of 36 months plus an annual travel allowance of 2,000 EUR
- Up to 5 doctoral memberships for applicants who have secured their own third-party funding (e.g. in the form a scholarship by a German partyafilliated foundation). Funding should have been obtained for a period of 24-36 months





### Application requirements

The formal requirement for an application is a university degree (M.A. or equivalent; the degree must have been obtained before the application deadline) with above average marks in either American or Canadian Studies, one of the disciplines represented at the John F. Kennedy Institute (Cultural Studies, Literature, Political Science, History, Sociology, and Economics) or closely related academic programs. The discipline of the intended dissertation must correspond to the discipline of the M.A.-degree, or at least be closely related to it.

The dissertation project must be related to North American and/or American/Canadian Studies.









### **Application documents**

- A Curriculum Vitae (in English)
- A Statement of Purpose, approx. 2 pages (in English)
- Copies of Earned Degrees/Diplomas/Graduation Certificates (High School, BA, MA, etc.)
- An Outline of the Dissertation Project (Exposé), 8 10 pages (in English)
- A Work Plan/Timeline (in English)
- A Writing Sample based on a chapter of the MA thesis or an already published journal article (in English or German)
- Proof of Language Proficiency in English C1-Level EFR (TOEFL, IELTS, CAS, CPE)
- Two *Recent Letters of Reference* (to be uploaded separately by the respective referee by December 15, 2020)


