General description

- an explanation of the reasons for the distinctiveness of Sino-Marxist philosophy
- an insight into the philosophical and ideological foundations of the PRC

Learning outcomes

After the module, a student:

- is familiarized with the thought of the most prominent Chinese Marxists
- possesses the ability to understand the sources of Chinese Communist ideology
- is able to analyze and compare the core concepts of Maoism and Dengism
- knows the general contribution of Chinese Marxism to the development of socialism
- has improved their intercultural communication skills

Course Requirements and Grading

Students are evaluated based on: participation in the course (20%); preparation of a short talk on a selected problem of Chinese Marxism (30%), and comprehensive oral exam covering all thinkers discussed during the classes (50%).
